Policy – Conflict Minerals

In order to comply with the terms of the 2010 U.S. Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, Article 1502, our policy prohibit use of conflict minerals, unless the minerals are bought from responsible sources in the region. The conflict minerals are defined as Tin, Tantalum, Tungsten and Gold (including their derivatives) originating from the Democratic Republic of Congo or its surrounding countries.

We expect our suppliers to support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed human rights (such as the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights.) and ensure that they are not complicit in human rights abuses.

We use the EICC-GeSI due diligence tool to communicate up and down our supply chain. Once a validated supply chain is established through initiatives such as full-fledged smelter verification under EICC-GeSI's Conflict-Free Smelter or development of a mineral tracing program, we will require our suppliers to procure the minerals through that validated supply chain.
